# Back to School Renewal

For many of us, September feels as much as the start of a new year as January does. I spoke to a few educators in our community about this going back to school time of year.

Anne Finnimore is a grade 5-6 teacher. She told me that she loves the fresh start, new relationships, and getting back to a familiar routine. Megan Emmett, a former elementary music teacher and now the CEO of the Youth Singers of Calgary, told me that she loves the excitement and energy for renewed learning experiences and that she looks forward to making new friends. Kim Lu, a yoga teacher at the Alexandra Centre, shared that she has a sense of coming home in September.

Megan loves seeing the singers again and how much they've grown. Ernán McLoughlin, a piano teacher, also enjoys seeing how much the kids have grown over the summer. Anne let me know that she also looks forward to seeing former students in the halls. Kim told me that she usually greets her yoga students with a hug, and that "it's about connection as a community" which is even more impactful than the yoga itself.

Henna Viertio is a faculty member in the Early Childhood Education and Development Program at Bow Valley College. What she loves best about the fall term is "seeing the excitement in my students as they learn about the importance of outdoor play in all seasons and in all kinds of weather. As we say in Finland: 'There is no bad weather, only poor clothing!'"

I also work at Bow Valley College, and find September to be a time of renewed energy and optimism for both staff and students. I love

reconnecting with colleagues and feeling the excitement around the College as new and returning learners arrive. I do agree with Anne who shared, "I love the buzz and energy of September but it can be a lot. Keeping that summer feeling can be tough once you get started but every year seems to fly by!"

I asked them all about what they are looking forward to in the upcoming school year. Henna is anticipating "continuing to weave outdoor pedagogy, land-based learning, and Indigenous ways of knowing into my learning and teaching. Our personal outdoor experiences, sit spots, regular connecting with the land create the space not only to mindfulness, but bodyfulness, where the present moment has the capacity for the infinite." Anne is "looking forward to a school year that feels familiar and predictable with intramurals and extra curricular activities. For some kids that's the best part of their day!" Ernán is excited about seeing—and hearing—his advanced piano students rise to the challenges they set together, and indeed to seeing the progress everyone will make this year.

These educators all displayed great passion for what they do. Megan enthusiastically shared, "Arts education makes your life so much better. School can be busy, but don't forget to nourish yourself through music." Youth Singers of Calgary is offering half price on registration fees for new high school aged and adult singers. Ernán told me that the most important things in the world are music, friends, and the world itself. Kim says she feels a joy in coming back to teaching yoga in September, and aims to help people achieve a mind-body connection.

Henna shared, "Let's change the game in our classrooms and our communities and invite that spirit of awe, that newness of the fall season, and that desire to discover back into our curriculum and our lives. As the leaves change colour and head for their annual rejuvenation period, perhaps we, too, can share similar experiences. Let's take advantage of the daylight hours and cooler evenings, enjoy the forests, lakes, and mountains around us, and let the children play in the puddles."

## Project Update

The Brewery-Rail Lands project team would like to thank all stakeholders who have shared their interest and input to date. Since launching the application in February 2022, we have actively engaged with various individuals and stakeholders through multiple channels, including direct email correspondence and our digital information sessions held on March 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022. We've also hosted a series of focused meetings with major adjacent property owners and varied stakeholder groups. We continue to engage and respond to feedback from all stakeholders and will consider refinements to the Plan through the review phase of the application.

The Project Team is currently in a robust review dialogue with The City of Calgary through the Development Applications Review Team—discussing considerations and development details of various scale and complexity. A What We're Hearing Report from our stakeholder engagement sessions and all other feedback received to date will be released in the month of September—we anticipate being in touch in early fall of this year to share additional updates and opportunities to engage with us on the refined vision for the Brewery-Rail Lands.



## Do you know about DOAP?

Depending on your experience you may not have heard of the Downtown Outreach Addictions Partnership (DOAP) team before. They are a group of people supported by Alpha House Society who work very closely with Calgary's houseless and vulnerable populations. They have teams available 24/7/365 and can be the best team to call when you see a vulnerable person in need.



For a lot of people experiencing homelessness or who are in vulnerable situations in our city, and our community, interactions with the police may not always be positive experiences and the police service is not always the best service to call to help. When you see someone in distress, or living/sleeping where they shouldn't be, please call 211 to be dispatched to the DOAP team or call the DOAP team directly (403.998.7388).

**It can sometimes be unclear when to call DOAP and when to call 911.**

**Call DOAP when:**

- Individuals are **not** demonstrating violent behaviour
- Do not appear to need medical attention

Once DOAP has attended the individual they will contact 911 if further resources are necessary.

**Call 911 when:**

- Individuals are demonstrating violent behaviour
- Individuals needs immediate medical attention

In Ramsay we pride ourselves on being good neighbours. Calling the right service for those in need is one simple way that we can extend that compassion to those who may need it most.

## Inglewood Station

### Integrated Mixed Use Facility



#### Background

In the 2019-2022 budget, the Calgary Fire Department received Council-approved funding and direction to construct and operate a new Fire Station on the project site, with a public selection process for a delivery partner via the *Integrated Civic Facility Planning Program*. The City's *Integrated Civic Facility Planning Program* plans and delivers multi-service and mixed use facilities that utilize City-owned land more efficiently, enabling multiple community services / uses in one location and better serving benefiting communities. Following a public Request for Proposals process, RNDSQR emerged as the highest rated proponent chosen to work with The City, Calgary Fire Department and a multi-disciplinary team of local planning, design, and engineering professionals in the planning and development of the new Inglewood Station Integrated Mixed Use Facility.

#### Proposed Land Use Redesignation

The current Land Use District's building height and Floor Area Ratio (FAR) do not allow for a mid-rise, mixed use development vision that can meet the Inglewood Fire Station's two key project goals:

1. Realize a modern 2-bay Fire Station funded, owned and operated by The City (Calgary Fire Department), as part of a medium to high density mixed-use transit oriented development.
2. Deliver an appropriate mix of housing, commercial / retail or other private use(s) to be financed, designed, constructed, owned and operated by a private entity (RNDSQR).

A Land Use Redesignation is required to achieve the above goals and associated building program requirements:

**From:** Commercial - Corridor 2 District (C-COR2f2.8h12)  
**Maximum Floor Area Ratio (FAR): 2.8 | Maximum Building Height: 12m**

**To:** Mixed Use - General District (MU-1f6.5h45)  
**Maximum Floor Area Ratio (FAR): 6.5 | Maximum Building Height: 45m**

# Alexandra Centre Society Classes

This fall, the Alexandra Centre Society (ACS), located on 9th avenue in Inglewood, will be running affordable adult yoga classes on Thursday evenings; parent and child music classes on Friday and Saturday mornings; children's dance classes on Saturday mornings; and adult language classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

The ACS is a registered charitable organization that focuses on managing the historic Alexandra Centre building as an affordable and accessible community centre for all. Because of this mandate, we are able to offer bursaries to residents that need it, and to offer class rates lower than most comparable businesses.

The ACS takes care to work with quality instructors. Our music classes are run by Andrea Bohdan, who has trained in both Suzuki and Orff early childhood music training. Parent and child music classes have been a long-standing offering at the Alexandra Centre Society, going


on for the past 15+ years. Children's dance classes are run by Jennifer Mahood, a fellow Ramsay resident who operates Art in Motion Dance Education. Spanish and French language classes are run by Azren the Language Nerd. Kim Lu offers gentle hatha yoga practice to loosen and stretch painful muscles, reduce stress, improve circulation, protect joints, and build strength and balance.

# St. Anne's Academic Centre

St. Anne's has been in Ramsay since 1909, with Miss Ethel MacDonald teaching in the vestry of St. Anne's Church on 21 Ave SE. A one-room school was soon built at the back of the church, and eventually the existing school building was constructed. The Ursuline Sisters taught at the school for some time. It became a community school within the Calgary Catholic School district (CSSD), and closed in 1984. In 1985, it reopened as a francophone school. When it became St. Anne's Academic Centre, its focus was to provide mature students (aged 17-19) the opportunity to complete graduation requirements and to upgrade marks, with flexible scheduling.

Randy Smith is the principal of St. Anne's, and shared with me that the school continues to support mature students, in a wide variety of ways. "The beauty of this place," he said, is that "it provides so much alternative support for students." The school offers classes in the traditional classroom setting, through self-directed studies, and in live online offerings—this emerged from the COVID-19 pandemic teaching and learning experience. A student from another high school in the CSSD can register for courses at St. Anne's, taking advantage of flexible options. In fact, students from across the province can take self-directed classes all year round.

St. Anne's provides other unique educational offerings. One is the Kara program, supporting pregnant and parenting teenagers. Another is Fresh Start, which provides an opportunity for students who need an alternative to the traditional high school to re-engage with their learning in a supportive and encouraging environment. Another is Home Education, with one teacher dedicated to coordinating home schooling for elementary and junior students. The school is adding modern languages and calculus to their course offerings this year, and is developing programming to support 18-19 year olds who are new to Canada to provide them basic language and life skills that they need to be successful in their new environment.


Over the summer, about 6000 students took part in self-directed summer school through St. Anne's. During the regular school year there are about 1000 students registered at the school.

There are about 100 adults working at St. Anne's, between teachers, education assistants, office assistants, and custodians.


